ENGLISH WRITING SHORT PARENT/STAFF TRAINING...

On Wednesday 27th, just after drop off I was hoping to do a very short training session for staff and parents together on a new writing resource that I have purchased called Mighty Writers. I anticipate this to be 8.45-9.15. This will hopefully support our younger children with oral storytelling, early writing skills and sentence construction. It can also be really useful with the older ones too in that it helps develop complex sentences structure and improved vocabulary choices. This is not to replace our wonderful Literacy Tree units, it is just to compliment it and be used as a supportive classroom tool. I thought it would useful to open this up to parents as well if you think you will find this useful. I will split the staff to cover classes and do teachers first followed by Teaching Assistants after you have left but as mentioned I think it is really useful to be able to share training and resources with you.
